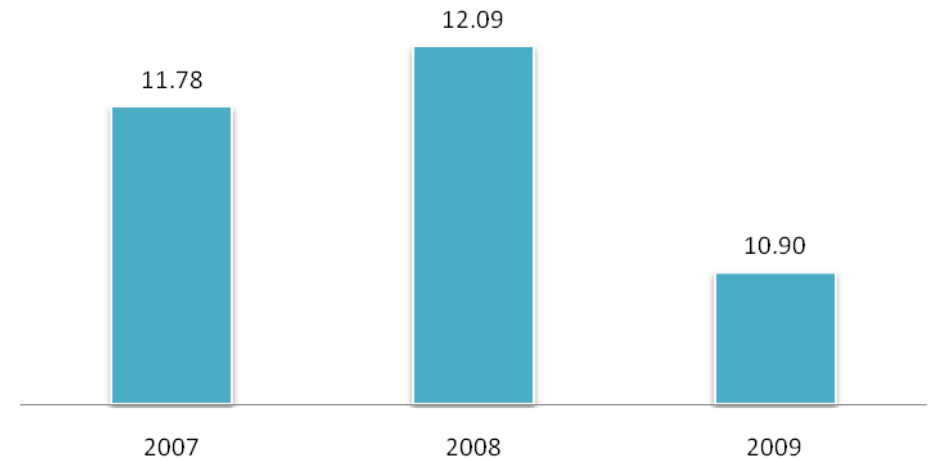


Levi Strauss & Co. is committed to reducing its climate change impact.

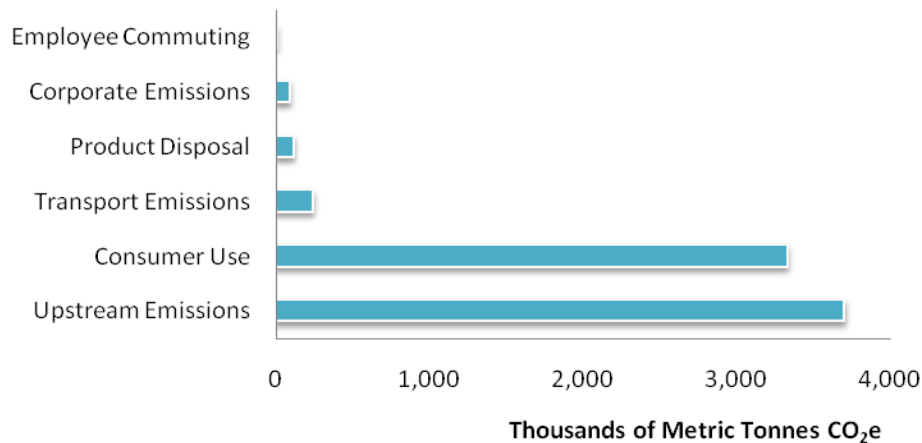
Over the past several years Levi Strauss & Co. (LS&Co.) has made great progress in reducing its contribution to climate change. We have taken several steps to increase the energy efficiency and decrease the emissions intensity (GHG emissions per 1000 square feet of owned and operated space) of our facilities. Actions such as lighting retrofits at our key distribution centers, a LEED certified rebuild of our corporate headquarters and general energy efficiency awareness building have resulted in a decrease in emissions intensity by 7.5% from 2007 to 2009.

We have also begun to measure the climate change impacts of our supply chain and a sample of our products. LS&Co. participated in the World Resources Institute (WRI)/World Business Council for Sustainable Development's (WBCSD) road test of the Scope Three and Product GHG emissions Protocols.

WRI Scope Three Protocol

LS&Co. partnered with the WRI and WBCSD to road test their new Scope Three and Product GHG Protocols. We learned a great deal about our supply chain and product based emissions through engagement in this exercise.

Through our supply chain, our greatest contribution to climate change comes from our upstream emissions. These emissions include cultivation and processing of raw materials, production of fabrics and the final cut, sew and finish of our products.

While upstream emissions are significant, consumer use of our products follows a close second in overall climate change impact.

WRI Product Protocol

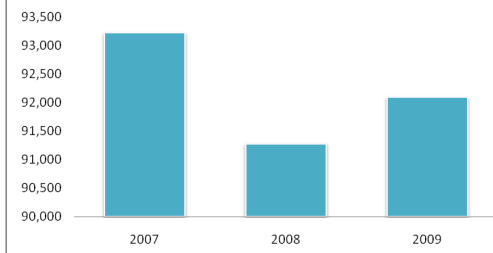
Similar to the results of the Scope Three road test, the product that we choose to assess for the Product Protocol road test showed a significant impact from both upstream emissions and consumer use. However, consumer use accounted for nearly 60% of the products impact while upstream emissions were nearer to 30% of the total.

External Communications

In 2009 LS&Co. carried forward our commitment to reporting only the highest quality GHG emissions inventory by reporting our third party verified corporate GHG emissions to both [The Climate Registry](#) and [The Carbon Disclosure Project](#).

While our emissions did increase from 2008 to 2009 due to a significant jump in the number of our retail stores, LS&Co was able to achieve a status of Climate Registered member with The Climate Registry signifying continued commitment to climate change abatement and quality
